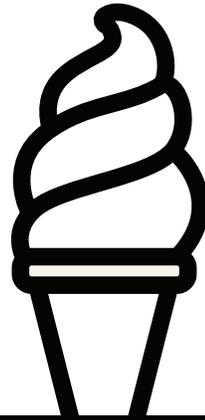

# CANADA'S ECONOMY DEPENDS ON IMMIGRATION

Immigrants from all over the world helped shape Canada into the amazing country it is today. For Canada to have a continued strong economy and good standard of living, we need good immigration policy.

In Canada, we rely on a large number of working Canadians to pay taxes in order to fund the public services and social safety net we depend on - like healthcare and the Canada Pension Plan.

With a declining natural birth rate and a rapidly aging population, Canada needs immigrants to fill gaps in our labour market and ensure that our workforce remains competitive.

60% of immigrants to Canada are economic immigrants. This means they come to Canada with training or education that allows them to make an immediate contribution to Canada's economy.

While other countries waver, Canada continues to attract high-skilled workers to support an innovative economy, while providing room for economic immigrants to bring their immediate families, and also doing our part to settle refugees seeking a safe new country to call home and to contribute to.

In Davenport, over 40% of our residents were born outside of Canada, creating one of the most diverse and vibrant communities in Toronto. Diversity is indeed our strength and Canada is stronger because of it.
