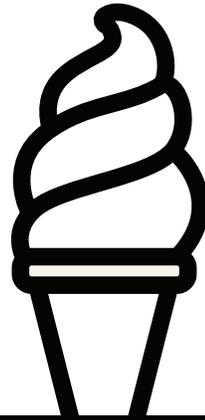

KEEPING TORONTO SAFE

We are proud of the overall low crime rate in Canada; however, gun violence is still prevalent in our communities. Torontonians can be assured that we hear their concerns and are taking steps to create a safer Canada - one that is free of gun-related violence.

That's why I recently sponsored Petition e-1923 signed by over 20,000 Canadians, which calls for a ban on the civilian ownership of handguns and military assault weapons. I have been a key advocate in the federal government for taking steps to address gun violence and am dedicated to ensuring that Torontonians feel safe in their neighbourhoods and streets.

Our federal government has been actively taking measures to reduce gun violence nationally. Bill C-71, that recently passed, puts in place measures that will make our communities less vulnerable to gun violence, while ensuring that responsible firearm owners are treated fairly. The bill enhances background checks, requires sellers to confirm the validity of a buyer's license, and ensures guns are not being moved throughout Canada without authorization - all without reinstating a federal long-gun registry.
