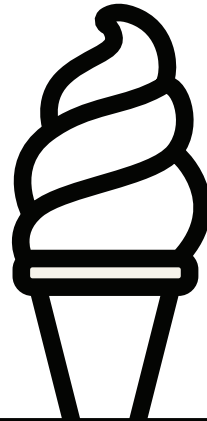

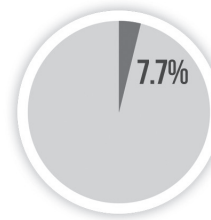
ONGOING WORK WITH INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

Our federal government is creating a renewed relationship with Indigenous Peoples, based on the recognition of rights, respect, co-operation, and partnership.

We have worked with First Nations to resolve historic grievances by settling 66 specific claims since November 2015. This is the highest rate of settlement since the process began in 1973, and it is twice the rate of the previous government.

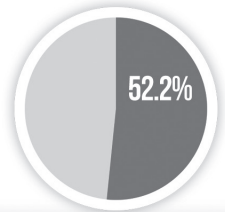
This government is committed to eliminating all long-term drinking water advisories on public water systems on reserve by March 2021, and is on track to meet this deadline. We have eliminated 86, and have 57 left to go.

We also passed Bill C-92 to address the over-representation of First Nations, Inuit and Métis children in the child and family services system. Our government has ensured that the law reflects what Indigenous peoples across this country have been asking for decades: that their inherent jurisdiction be affirmed so they can decide what is best for their children, their families, and their communities.
