

A BETTER QUALITY OF LIFE FOR SENIORS

Davenport is blessed to be home to a vibrant group of seniors.

Last summer, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau appointed Canada's first-ever Minister of Seniors to ensure that every senior in Canada is cared for.

Our government has kept our promise to restore the retirement age to 65, after the previous government's decision to raise it to 67, which is putting thousands of dollars back in the pockets of Canadians as they become seniors.

We've made increases to both OAS and GIS, so that a senior in Canada can now receive up to \$1,700 more per year compared to before we were in government. Under the leadership of our government, Canada finally reached an agreement to meaningfully improve the Canada Pension Plan, for the first time in over 20 years. The enhanced CPP will put up to 50% more into the pockets of retirees.

Earlier this year, I was proud to host the Hon. Filomena Tassi, Minister of Seniors, for a townhall at West Neighbourhood House. We heard concerns and feedback from seniors from diverse backgrounds, and had a productive discussion. This feedback contributed to the following government announcements this year:

- Introducing Canada's first National Dementia Strategy
- An additional \$100 million in funding for seniors programs to keep them active and engaged
- Firm commitment to implement national pharmacare
