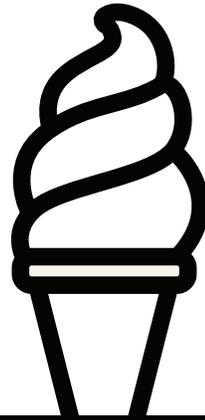

The Canada Summer Jobs program (CSJ) provides wage subsidies to employers from not-for-profit organizations, the public-sector, and private sector. It creates quality summer work experiences for youth aged 15-30, and helps young Canadians develop and improve their skills in a safe and inclusive workplace, free of harassment and discrimination.

I have fought hard to increase the Canada Summer Jobs funding for our community. I am pleased to say that during my time as an MP, I have successfully tripled the CSJ budget in Davenport! This will allow for almost \$900,000 to be devoted to creating employment opportunities for Davenport youth this year.
